Understanding that we would need to be fully aware of access routes into QEOP, the location of the site and it's public transport connections put it within easy reach of Stratford and local bus routes.



I don't have any major safety issues with roads, but I am just wondering who would steward/sign the routes into the site and more importantly who would manage a very drunken crowd back to their tents at the end of the night. I would be very surprised if LVRPA got permission to use this for festival goers and if LVRPA understands the risks of festival camp sites from both a criminal and HAS aspect.
