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



Obviously people will stay where they can, I am more concerned with camp sites as there could be 500+ people staying there.

I don't have any major safety issues with roads, but I am just wondering who would steward/sign the routes into the site and more importantly who would manage a very drunken crowd back to their tents at the end of the night. I would be very surprised if LVRPA got permission to use this for festival goers and if LVRPA understands the risks of festival camp sites from both a criminal and HAS aspect.

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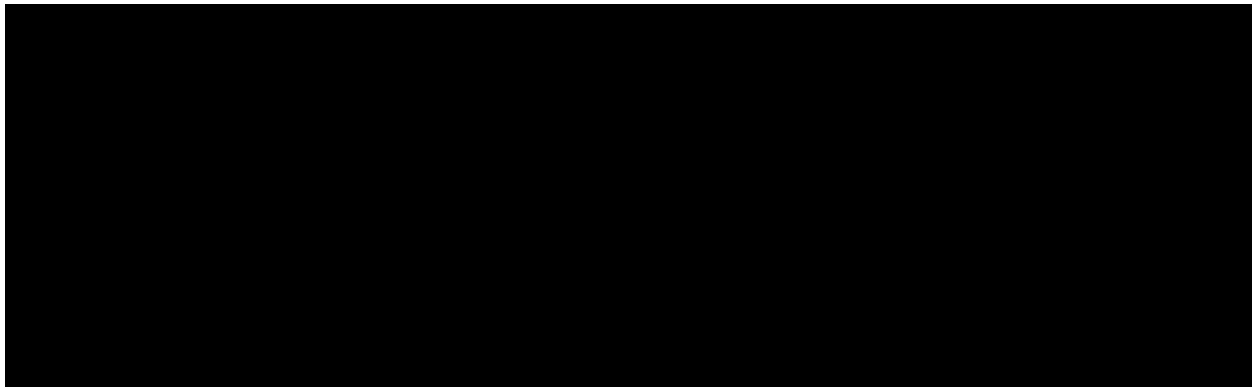

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
