**FREEDOM OF INFORMATION ACT 2000 – REQUEST 14-020**

Thank you for your request for information, received on 5 June 2014. You asked us the following questions

*“A Memorandum of Understanding between the Secretary of State for Culture, Media and Sport and the Mayor of London from 2012 (link here: <http://www.biglotteryrefund.org.uk/filearchive/2012%20DCMS%20Mayor%20Agreement.pdf>) stipulates monies diverted from Lottery Good Causes to pay for the Olympics will be repaid contingent on the sale of land on the Olympic Park site. The Memorandum has a schedule which lists the land to be sold. However, the schedule of land is very brief and does not give much indication of the size or specific location of each parcel of land. The listed parcels have no context and in this sense are fairly meaningless.*

**Request**

*Could you provide a map or other graphical representation of the scheduled land if one is available? If not I would be interested in finding out more about the land more generally. Perhaps some further information already exists from documentation supplied to the land registry or from promotional material which may have been prepared to help dispose of the land? I would be interested in a map which shows the plots specifically – perhaps shaded on the map, for example – rather than just a map of the entire park.”*

I can confirm that the London Legacy Development Corporation (the Legacy Corporation) holds information covered by your request.

Please find attached a map titled Olympic Park Legacy Company Land Ownership Plan (excluding the Three Mills Estate), dated 24 February 2011. It was created for our predecessor organisation, the Olympic Park Legacy Company (OPLC). The map shows the OPLC Leasehold and Freehold titles registered with the Land Registry at the time that the map was created, and references the Land Registry title number. The map does not include the Three Mills Estate. The red line on the Legend relates to the pre-Olympics London Development Agency compulsory purchase order 2005. To date, a more recent map has not been produced.
