FREEDOM OF INFORMATION ACT 2000 – REQUEST 14-021

Thank you for your request for information, received on 6 June 2014. You asked us the following question.

“Please supply all copies of correspondence, emails, reports held by the LLDC regarding the car park at East Marsh.”

We have considered your request and confirm that we hold the information you have requested. However, we have estimated that it would cost the London Legacy Development Corporation more than £450 to comply with your request. This figure, known as the ‘appropriate limit’, is specified by regulation, representing the cost of one person spending 18 hours determining whether we hold the information, and locating, retrieving and / or extracting it.

Our estimate is based in part on the analysis provided by our IT service provider where they have informed us that, while setting off the searches required is a straightforward process, the automated searches themselves would take over 40 days to complete. The estimate also includes the work that would then need to be undertaken retrieving and extracting the information relevant to your request from the search results.

As a consequence of the above estimation, we will not be processing this request further and this letter acts as a refusal notice under section 17(1) of the Act.

Please note if you could narrow the scope of your request in some way, we may be able to provide the information because it would cost less than the appropriate limit to do so, for

instance, could you focus the request in some way to make it less broad? Any reformulated request will be treated as a new request.

If you are unhappy with our response to your request and wish to make a complaint or request a review of our decision, you should write to:
