INFORMATION REQUEST REFERENCE 17-012

Dear 

Thank you for your information request, received on 15 February 2017. You asked the London Legacy Development Corporation (Legacy Corporation) to provide the following information under the Environmental Information Regulations 2004 (EIR):

“Is there housing for disabled people in East Village and if so how much, what kind of units and where is it located?”

I can confirm that the Legacy Corporation holds information relevant to your request on our planning register, accessible and searchable via our website: [Legacy Corporation Planning Register](#).

Planning application 14/00039/106 provides information on the provision for wheelchair accessible housing within the East Village plots N05, N06, N08, N16 and N18/19. These are the plots which the Legacy Corporation has granted reserved matters approvals pursuant to the outline planning permission for the Stratford City development. The submitted document ‘Market report of Wheelchair Accessible Housing’ dated January 2014 and officer’s report for planning application 14/00039/106 confirms that 10% of the units to be developed in each of the above plots will be wheelchair accessible.

This is in addition to the requirement secured under the Stratford City s.106 agreement (available on the [register](#) in the documents under application reference 10/90641/EXTODA) that all units meet Lifetime Homes standards (meaning standards set out in Meeting Part M and designing Lifetime Homes published by the Joseph Rowntree Foundation in 1999).

The January 2014 document within planning application 14/00039/106 also confirms that of the 2818 homes constructed in East Village (pursuant to reserved matters approvals granted by the Olympic Delivery Authority), 240 homes are wheelchair accessible, comprising 10% of the social rented units, 8% of the intermediate housing units and 8% (adaptable) of all other homes.
