Thank you for your information request, received on 3 April 2017. You asked the London Legacy Development Corporation (Legacy Corporation) to provide the following information under the Freedom of Information Act 2000 (FOIA):

"Please could you release any documents, reports, maps, evaluations (etc) related to the use of, or potential use of wifi, bluetooth or other mobile technologies to track visitors to the Queen Elizabeth Olympic Park?"

This request was further clarified as covering: "visitors once they are already in the park, or are just entering the park. For example, monitoring mobile devices picked up by wifi beacons within the park, to see the location of people within the park."

I can confirm that the Legacy Corporation holds information relevant to your request.

The Legacy Corporation offers visitors to Queen Elizabeth Olympic Park a free-to-use Wi-Fi service. The Wi-Fi service can be activated through a one-time-only registration screen; the user is asked for some basic information and is then given secure access to the Internet. The Wi-Fi service is subject to a set of terms and conditions which are published on the registration screen. User information is stored in a securely hosted repository, is anonymised for analysis and is only used for internal information purposes. Furthermore, we do not capture telephone numbers. The Park Wi-Fi service is also registered under the national Friendly Wi-Fi scheme.

The user data captured through the Park Wi-Fi service is used to get an aggregated and anonymised understanding of how the usage of the Wi-Fi service is spread across the Park, plus it gives us some general insight into the people who are visiting the Park; for example we are dedicated to ensuring that the Park is an attractive and accessible place for our local residents to visit and so it's useful for us to know how many of our registered Wi-Fi users reside within an east London postcode.

We also employ 10 crowd counting cameras at the most commonly used Park entrances / exits; these cameras can't identify individuals and the images are not permanently stored, but the system does give us a reasonably accurate head count, even across dense crowds of people. The data we get from these counts helps us to understand numbers of visitors to

the Park over certain time and date periods and can also help with wayfinding and crowd management planning.

There is currently no arrangement in place which allows for tracking the movement of people / devices around the Park, whether that's by way of the Wi-Fi network, probes, Bluetooth or other such technologies; however the Legacy Corporation is considering the implications and necessary controls relating to the capture of such data, as it would be useful to be able to see end-to-end crowd flows, common dwell areas and other potential route planning considerations.

Annex C: A screenshot of the initial landing page for the Park Wi-Fi service which shows the questions users are asked during the registration process.
