We do not normally allow protests/demonstrations or marches that lend towards either of those. Saying that, where a considerable amount of planning goes into a peaceful march we are able to consider an application should an appropriate area be identified and providing that safety and security is not compromised at any point.

In certain circumstances permission may be given for those who wish to hold a demonstration in the QEOP, so long as it does not directly relate to an activity within the park and or does not pose a risk to other park users. This is all taken into consideration along with a risk analysis and guidance from the Local Authority (LBN) and Metropolitan Police Service

LLDC may consider requests if:

- The date is available
- There is no risk of public disorder
- There is no entertainment involved
- Protest Group agree to QEOP's conditions and those of relevant authorities should agreements be reached
- Those attending should arrive by public transport or on foot.
- Banners or placards may not be displayed while in the park;
- Only a mobile public address system, brought into the park and removed on the same day and audible only to those participating, will be allowed;

- No collections of monies may take place in the park;

Your organisation would be invited to a meeting (providing the first stage is appropriate) with a designated representative from LLDC; the London Stadium; the Local Authority and The Metropolitan Police Service to discuss the proposed event.

If agreement in principle is gained, we will send you the form of indemnity, insurance requirements and agreement to sign and ask your organisation for the deposit. These documents must be signed and returned within 14 days from the date on the letter.

Formal permission may be given once we have received the signed documents and we have confirmation of any deposit as being cleared by our finance team.

If we do not receive the signed documents or the deposit within 14 days, the date will no longer be held and the event will not be able to take place. LLDC will confirm this by letter and or email. LLDC will write to say that your organisations application has lapsed and the specified date will no longer be held.

Whilst we would not actively seek to put obstacles in your way these are the minimum

requirements needed for us to consider a potential protest march, and like John has stated we need to ensure the safety and security of all residents, tenants, visitors and those of yourself and the fan groups is not compromised.

There are events at both the Copper Box and Here east on Saturday with significant vehicle movements expected in the area (in addition to the usual heavy weekend Westfield traffic.) 

Road Traffic Special Events Act 1994

- 1. Prohibition or restriction on roads in connection with certain events.
- 1. After section 16 of the Road Traffic Regulation Act 1984 there shall be inserted—
- "16A Prohibition or restriction on roads in connection with certain events.
- (1) In this section "relevant event" means any sporting event, social event or entertainment which is held on a road.
- (2) If the traffic authority for a road are satisfied that traffic on the road should be restricted or prohibited for the purpose of—
- (a) facilitating the holding of a relevant event,
- (b) enabling members of the public to watch a relevant event, or
- (c) reducing the disruption to traffic likely to be caused by a relevant event,

the authority may by order restrict or prohibit temporarily the use of that road, or any part of it, by vehicles or vehicles of any class or by pedestrians, to such extent and subject to such conditions or exceptions as they may consider necessary or expedient.

Given that roads are closed under a permanent Traffic Management Order around the London Stadium and the Queen Elizabeth 2 Park, I feel that the Council has done what it can through a permanent process to reduce traffic disruption on match days. As this protest is in the public domain as shown by the link attached, there would be likelihood that other elements i.e. rival supporters, etc. may try to influence or disrupt it, and cause public order issues.

West Ham at the London Stadium has heard there is chatter on social media about this possibility.

I have advised both and and verbally that the Police have their own Powers under the Public Order Act 1986, the Road Traffic Regulation Act 1984, and the Section 52 of the Metropolitan Police Act 1839 (Commissioners Directions) to be able to deal with this.

I'm not aware if Active Newham are involved in any permissions given to use the park, or whether this has just been chosen due to the proximity to Stratford by the protest, nor the QE2 Park by LLDC.

My major concern is that with the works being undertaken by Newham, and the utilities for the Stratford Gyratory Scheme, there will be lots of cones, barrier rails, spoil and other materials laying around which would be a source of ammunition for those who would seek to disrupt this protest or cause damage to property.

and I are to attend the meeting tomorrow at Lambeth, I would seek some conformation of the CE stance on not doing anything on this please. We have had similar issues with spontaneous events in the past and I attach some previous correspondence to police where we said we would not be making a S16A Order as the legislation doesn't cover it for information.
