Thank you for your information request, received on 16 May 2018. You asked the London Legacy Development Corporation (Legacy Corporation) to provide the following information under the Freedom of Information Act 2000 (FOIA):

Following on from the Legacy Corporation FOI response 18-022:

"I would be grateful, therefore, if you could provide the following information:

- 1. Please confirm that I am correct in now thinking that the LLDC does not keep a register or record of affordable housing outcomes.
- 2. I have looked at the monitoring information provided. Looking at the latest information for 2017, I came across the statement in Appendix 1 3 Supply of housing: "In 2017, the net number of housing completions recorded on the database was 753 units." Please confirm that when you say the cost of searching would exceed limits that there is a database which contains all of the information and that it is a search of this database that would exceed limits.
- 3. Is this database publicly available in any form?"

I can confirm that the Legacy Corporation holds information relevant to your request. The information related to housing and affordable housing that is reported in the annual Planning Authority Monitoring Report is drawn from the LLDC Planning Register for information about numbers granted planning permission and as you are aware this is publicly available and accessible: <u>Planning register</u>.

There is no specific separate affordable housing register held. In terms of data on the numbers of units completed, this results from on-the ground monitoring by officers which is then reflected in the data, along with that for permissions, within the Mayor of London's London Development Database (LDD) which is available via the GLA website: London development database.

I have attached a background spreadsheet used by officers to input into this for your information in **Annex A**. It should be noted that the schemes identified have been permitted at different points in time, by different planning authorities and reflect the national and local

planning policy situation at that time rather than necessarily the current policy requirements set by the Mayor or locally by the Legacy Corporation in its Local Plan.
