Work has been undertaken to assure that LS185 comply with their contractual obligations, which reflect E20 commitments to London Marathon Trust, London Borough of Newham and LLDC. This included sending a non-compliance letter to LS185 to address concerns over LS185 plans for use, and commitment to community obligations. 4.3. London Borough of Newham officers have been instrumental in holding LS185 to account. The Council are considering some improvements to the facility, including potential location of the Council's Learning Zone previously identified for another area of the stadium. 4.4. To fulfil its obligations, E20 has paid for the community track equipment at a cost of c.£50,000. An approval for this payment is included in the Financial Update. 4.5. More broadly on community activity, an E20-LLDC-LBN-LS185 steering group met on 15 August. Updated community plans are now being prepared by LS185 and West Ham United, in time to be considered at the 26 September E20 Board. At this stage E20 is not pursuing a community plan with UKA given the current uncertainty around athletics at the stadium. If and when the 2018 stadium athletics events are confirmed, E20 intends to request 5000 community tickets, plus a Newham sports day in the stadium. Discussions have been opened between the GLA, UKA, LS185 and E20 on a relay based event on the 18 July 2019.					
	9.3. It also records that the settlement of the excess seating capacity dispute does not change the position on community tickets, which remains as set out in the Concession Agreement. The letter is clear that E20 has met its commitment in the CBA to set out the legal process to remove community tickets from the concession agreement, and E20 can do no more until LBN and WHU progress a direct agreement. There is little evidence of this progressing.

12.2. Highlights in the period were:

- 12.2.1. The Community Track hosted Stand Up to Cancer's "Sprintathon" event on Thursday 25 July 2019. The charity event raised over £100,000. The organisation was delighted with the support from all involved at London Stadium to deliver the event and have pencilled a date in the diary for next year.
- 12.2.2. The Community Track delivered the final 4 school sports days of 2019 throughout July. Planning for 2020 school sports days is now underway, with discussion with BMA to take place regarding the management and scheduling of all bookings.
- 12.2.3. Elite Athletics used the track and fitness room for a series of training sessions during the build up to the Muller Anniversary Games. LMCT was also used as the pre-competition area for the athletes on both days.
- 12.2.4. Victoria Park Harriers hosted their annual 5K event at the Community Track on Friday 26 July. Over 170 runners attended, generating substantial interest in club participation prior to their 30-week LMCT tenancy, starting in September.

11. COMMUNITY COMMITMENTS

Attendance – 6712 for August and September 2019

- 11.1. The Community Track was used as a fan zone space for West Ham United's pre-season friendly on 3rd August (WHU v Atletico Bilbao). The area was filled with family fun activities and attracted an attendance of over 1800. As a result of this success, we hosted a similar fan zone activation for the WHU Women's Super League match versus Tottenham Hotspur on 29th September attracting over 1100 people.
- 11.2. Engie UK hosted a fantastic charity sports day event on 15th August, working in partnership with The Prince's Trust and their 'Million Makers' initiative. The event raised £1697.26 for the charity.
- 11.3. We hosted disability charity 'Whizz Kidz' for their fully accessible sporting event on 7th September. This event was in aid of the 75,000 wheelchair users across the UK and was a fun day of disability sporting competition, raising significant awareness for the charity. We are already planning for next year's event.
- 11.4. Works to install the Throws Cage were undertaken in August. Extensive work to dig the cage sockets, and a subsequent visit to erect the cage were completed. A final visit from the supplier is scheduled for 22nd October where final snagging and sign off will be completed.

- 11.1. The installation of our Throws Cage is now complete. We now await a proposal of usage from Newham & Essex Beagles prior to their throws training, including external risk assessments. All internal RAMS are complete.
- 11.2. The Community Track hosted the annual Newham Athletics Network review meeting on 11th October. All 2019 NAN activity was reviewed, and proposals to improve community engagement within the network were discussed. LS185 received a request for an additional 6 hours LMCT access at weekends. Discussions are ongoing to determine feasibility.
- 11.3. We hosted three football matches throughout October, hosting Westfield Stratford, Deloitte, and London City Airport.
- 11.4. Vinci Facilities carried out work to rectify floodlighting issues and were able to repair/replace 7 of the defective bulbs. 4 bulbs remain defective VF have ordered parts.
