**INFORMATION REQUEST REFERENCE 22-023**

Thank you for your information request, received on 11 July 2022. You asked the London Legacy Development Corporation (Legacy Corporation) to provide the following information under the Freedom of Information Act 2000 (FOIA):

*“In 2007, £425m was transferred from the Big Lottery Fund to Olympics 2012 organisers.*

*By March 2019, £68.5m had been returned to the National Lottery Community Fund from LLDC through money generated by the sale of assets, according to then charities minister Mims Davies. This left £356.5m outstanding.*

*Could you let me know how much money has been repaid by LLDC to the National Lottery Community Fund in total as of 31 June 2022?”*

A commitment was made in 2007 by the Government, and endorsed by the (then) Mayor of London, that the sum of £675m would be returned to the National Lottery Distributors from the receipts of land sales effected by the London Development Agency (now London Legacy Development Corporation (LLDC)) at Queen Elizabeth Olympic Park.

The National Lottery Funding Repayment Agreement (‘the Agreement’) between the Department for Digital, Culture, Media and Sport (DCMS) and the Greater London Authority (GLA), signed in 2012, sets out the basis upon which the return of any monies would be affected.

As at 31 March 2022, total LLDC land receipts are £239m of which £167m are subject to the Agreement.

Under the Agreement, all of the £167m is retained by the GLA or LLDC (at the discretion of the GLA).
