INFORMATION REQUEST REFERENCE 23-035

Thank you for your information request, received on 23 October 2023. You asked the London Legacy Development Corporation (Legacy Corporation) to provide the following information under the Freedom of Information Act 2000 (FOIA):

“During the tendering for the management of Chobham Manor it must be assumed that L&Q submitted service level agreements / KPIs when they made this submission to the LLDC/LLP.

Can you please send me the document that contains this information?”

At this time, I cannot confirm that the Legacy Corporation holds information relevant to your request. Searches have been undertaken by multiple areas of the organisation and to date we have not been able to identify the information requested, confirm that it exists or if we hold it.

Considering the resources used to date the Legacy Corporation are refusing this response as the cost of compliance would exceed the appropriate limit as defined by FOIA section 12.

Section 12 - Exemption where cost of compliance exceeds appropriate limit.

(1) Section 1(1) does not oblige a public authority to comply with a request for information if the authority estimates that the cost of complying with the request would exceed the appropriate limit.

The Legacy Corporation has estimated that the resources that would be required to identify if this information is held, and if it is, locate this information would far exceed the appropriate limit.

The appropriate limit is £450, calculated as 18 hours at the rate of £25 per hour, however, only the time taken to;

- a. establishing if the information is held
- b. locating the information
- c. retrieving the information and
- d. extracting the information

can be taken into consideration when calculating the estimated costs of answering the request.

In addition to individuals within several Directorates being involved in searching for the information, searches were also conducted on the Legacy Corporation file servers using multiple search criteria. No information relevant to the request was identified.

The Legacy Corporation is not a large organisation and the time and resources taken to answer the request would have a considerable impact on those resources.

The Legacy Corporation have considered the public interest in respect to their decision and appreciate that they also must balance public interest with the effective, efficient and economic use of the resources that they have responsibility for as a public authority. In this instance, the Legacy Corporation cannot justify the disproportionate burden this request would place on the Legacy Corporation's limited resources or the impact it would have on delivery of its other responsibilities.
