

Accessibility

The event site is accessible for wheelchair users and has been designed to ensure that level routes are provided across the whole Park.

The Park Mobility service supports visitors with a range of physical and visual access needs, with help from trained volunteer Park Champions.

The service is based at the Information Point **(please see map)**.

Available services include buggies, mobility scooters, and wheelchairs. To book, contact Customer Services on **0800 0722 110**.

Toilets and baby changing facilities

The main toilet facilities for the Festival, including an accessible toilet, are located behind the V&A East Museum, next to The Waterfront Stage.

Accessible toilets and baby change facilities are available at Sadler's Wells East, V&A East Museum and Riverside East, plus an accessible toilet at London Aquatics Centre.

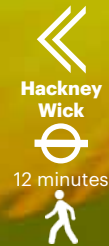
